

Topic: David and Goliath

- That the children learn and understand the significance of the story of David and Goliath.

Welcome & Worship

Welcome all the kids. Ask them to tell you about their favourite BIG animal (e.g. elephant, lion, giraffe)

The Facilitator will let you know when it is time for Kids Worship. Please have the children form a line and make their way to the Kids Worship room to join with the other children for Worship. Please encourage the children to join in and help the other children to engage. We would also ask that you participate as the children will watch you also.

Recap on Last week:

Story:

Read the story from David and Goliath 'See and say story book. This will be in the room for you on Sunday. Or please feel free to tell this story in another creative way if you feel inspired!


Activity:

Materials that you will need:

- Paper bag
- Ribbon
- Textas / pencils / Crayons
- Stones template page or brown paper
- Stapler

Directions:

1. Give each child a paper bag.
2. Allow them to decorate it.
3. Have them cut out and decorate their stones (use the template page or cut their own from brown paper).
4. Attach ribbon to the bag.
5. They can then keep their stones in the pouch.



Lesson Review

- The memory verse for this week is:



Find a creative way to help the kids to learn this verse

- Noticeboard focus: Ask the children to tell you what they learnt about today then add the memory verse poster to the noticeboard (the card can be found in the folder in the leaders' resource spot).
- Give each child a memory verse card and tell them that if they can remember this verse next week they will get a sweet. (Memory verse cards are in the Leaders Resources spot) Please remember to do this as they are an important part of us connecting with the children's families.

Wrap up:

- Have a leader or helper close in prayer.
- Make sure kids take their craft at the end of the lesson.
- Please ensure that they are signed out by a parent or guardian before they leave the room.
- Once all the children have left please assist us by making sure the room is tidy and ready for the next group. Please also make sure that the blue sign-in folder is returned to the kids table.



Game 1:

David's Stones

- Gather together masking tape, a ruler, five smaller smooth stones for David's stones and one large smooth stone to represent Goliath. The smaller smooth stones should be approximately 1-2 inches in diameter and the Goliath stone should be 3-4 inches in diameter. Set up the game on a smooth surface such as a hard basement floor or linoleum. Make a 2-foot by 2-foot square on the smooth surface with the masking tape. Place the Goliath stone in the center of the square. Players take turns with David's five stones to slide them across the floor to try to knock the Goliath stone out of the square. Players must start their David stones outside of the square. Keep track of how many shots it takes each child to remove the Goliath stone. If it takes more shots than the five stones, this is acceptable. Recycle the stones and allow the child to keep trying.

Game 2:

Make a David and Goliath Beanbag Toss Game

- Cut a sheet of butcher paper about nine feet long, or tape several smaller sheets together.
- Draw a simple picture of Goliath that takes up the whole paper. You may want to enlarge a coloring page picture of Goliath using a photocopier, then cut it out and tape it to the paper.
- Spread the Goliath game out on the floor. Tape the edges of the paper to the floor, or secure the corners with small weights.
- Have the children line up in front of Goliath's feet and give them the beanbags. Use five beanbags, to match the five stones David had.
- Have the kids toss the "stone" beanbags at Goliath's forehead and see how close they can get.
- Talk about how David needed God to defeat Goliath. Ask the kids how God can help them overcome big problems in their lives.


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
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
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
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Leading Prayer in Kids Bizz

Come Together:

Bring the children together in a circle. Ask if there is anything that they would like to pray for.

Some Questions you may ask to help them think:

- Is there something that you would like to praise God and thank him for this week?
- Are you sick or do you need healing?
- Have you hurt anyone or been hurt by something this week that you need to ask forgiveness for?

Pray:

Pray together— there are two choices here:

They can pray for each other or they can pray for themselves (out loud).

Praying for Each other:

If they would like someone else to pray for them ask the child to sit in the middle and for another child to pray for them (ask for volunteers). If both children are comfortable they can lay hands on as they pray.

Praying for themselves:

If they would like to pray for themselves they can either sit in the middle or stay where they are. Ask them to pray in a loud voice so everyone can hear. We want them to be comfortable so be flexible and sensitive to the Childs needs.

Continue through the group until everyone has been prayed for.

Listen:

Then take time to sit and listen to God and see if there is anything that he would like to say to the group. Ask each child to sit silently and listen to God. Explain that God may speak to them all in different ways, e.g. a picture, an idea a colour etc. Then after a minute ask if there is anything the children felt God was saying.

Write:

If anyone has anything please write it in the *Kids Bizz Prayer Journal* with the date, service time and child's name. Then have a leader thank God for the lesson and any healings, words or pictures.
